FROM THE WEST

(London, Sarnia, Toronto International Airport)
Follow Hwy. 401 East to Hwy. 427 South. Take Hwy. 427 South and follow signs for Hwy. QEW (Queen Elizabeth Way). The QEW turns into the Gardiner Expressway. Take York St. exit ramp (stay on the left hand side of the ramp) Turn right on to Queen, Motor Court entrance is on immediate right hand side.

FROM THE NORTH (North bay, barrie)

Follow Hwy 400 South to Hwy. 401 West. Follow Hwy. 401 West to Hwy. 427 South. Take Hwy. 427 South and follow signs for Hwy. QEW (Queen Elizabeth Way). The QEW turns into the Gardiner Expressway.
