**Rita Charon, M.D., Ph.D.**

Professor of Clinical Medicine and  
Director of the Program in Narrative Medicine  
at Columbia University, New York, NY, USA

Dr. Charon is a general internist in practice in New York City and a literary scholar specializing in the works of Henry James. She founded and directs the Program in Narrative Medicine, overseeing a widespread effort in education, scholarship, and research in the dividends of narrative skills for health care. Dr. Charon is author of *Narrative Medicine: Honoring the Stories of Illness* and co-editor of *Psychoanalysis and Narrative Medicine and Stories Matter: The Role of Narrative in Medical Ethics*. She and her Core Faculty at Columbia offer intensive training in narrative medicine for health care professionals and trainees, including a new Master of Science in Narrative Medicine degree program.
