SERGE GAUTHIER, MD, FRCPC

Dr. Gauthier is the Director of the Alzheimer's Disease Research Unit. He completed his medical studies at the Université de Montréal and specialty training in Neurology at McGill University, followed by a Medical Research Council of Canada Fellowship in Neurochemistry at Professor Ted Sourkes' laboratory. He was a Geriatrician at the Montréal Neurological Hospital and Institute from 1976 to 1985, and the Director of the McGill

Centre for Studies in Aging from 1986 to 1997. He is currently Senior Scientist of the Medical Research Council/Pharmaceutical Manufacturers Association of Canada Health Program. Professor, Departments of Neurology & Neurosurgery, Psychiatry, Medicine; Associate Member School of Physical & Occupational Therapy, Department of Pharmacology & Therapeutics, McGill University.



SUSAN L. MITCHELL, MD, MPH

Dr. Mitchell is a Geriatrician and health services researcher, a Professor of Medicine at Harvard Medical School and Senior Scientist at the Hebrew Senior Life Institute for Aging Research in Boston. She graduated from the University of Ottawa Medical School, and has a Master's degree in Public Health from Harvard. She is a member of the Association of American Physicians. Her research focuses on decision-making and resource

utilization in advanced dementia. She has been the Principal Investigator on several NIH funded grants that aim to improve the end-of-life experience for patients with advanced dementia and their families. In 2009, Dr. Mitchell published the first landmark issue in the New England Journal of Medicine on experiences faced in the final stages of advanced dementia.
