



**Clinician Educator Faculty Position  
Division of Respiriology  
Department of Pediatrics**

The Department of Pediatrics at McMaster University and McMaster Children's Hospital are seeking **two full-time academic physicians** to join the Division of Pediatric Respiriology. The successful candidate(s) will be considered clinician educators and will be expected to share responsibility for education and research within the division, as well as comprehensive clinical services. McMaster Children's Hospital functions as a referral Centre for the regions of South-Central Ontario extending from Niagara to Kitchener-Waterloo and beyond. McMaster Children's Hospital is one of the two busiest children's hospitals in Ontario offering specialized care to over 150,000 children each year.

These positions will incorporate an academic appointment and salary will be commensurate with the experience and expertise of the applicant(s). The Division of Pediatric Respiriology aims to develop and further expand its range of clinical, academic and research interests. These positions will also offer an associated leadership role(s); therefore, the successful candidates must have demonstrated leadership abilities. Applicants should be certified (or eligible for certification) by the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada in Pediatrics and must have completed a Pediatric Respiriology Fellowship. Applicants must be licensed (or eligible for licensure) in the Province of Ontario.
