Childhood Obesity Update: What is new? Will it impact your practice?

Dr. Morrison is also the Co-Director of the Metabolism And Childhood Obesity (MAC-Obesity) Research Program at McMaster University. Dr. Morrison's research focuses on the determinants of cardiometabolic health in childhood and her clinical research is centered upon the consequences and treatment of obesity and lipid disorders in children. Her work is supported by the Heart and Stroke Foundation of Canada and the Canadian Institutes of Health Research.
