FROM TORONTO

- QEW Niagara to 403 Hamilton.
- Exit on York Blvd.
- Follow York Blvd. to John Street.
- Turn LEFT on John Street and Continue North to Murray.
- Turn LEFT on Murray.
- LIUNA Station is on the RIGHT.

FROM THE ESCARPMENT

- Take Upper Wentworth exit from the 'Linc'.
- Go NORTH on Upper Wentworth to Fennell
- Turn LEFT onto Fennell.
